REPORT ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE JAPANESE BRANCH OF JAML

For more than ten years, the relationship between IAML and Japan has been rather personal. At the same time, there has been continuous participation in RILM and occasional participation in RISM. Individual members such as Mr. Shigeru Joho, Ms. Noriko Murai and Ms. Hiroko Kishimoto participated in the conferences from time to time.

In recent years, however, some concrete activities have been carried out in Japan, especially during the past two years. Seven small meetings were held and the establishment of the national branch of IAML was discussed.

At the general assembly of the IAML Japanese members held on June 9th this year, we adopted the by-laws of the branch. And the executive board members were elected. Following this action, the establishment of the national branch was accomplished.

As regards the members of the Japanese branch, there are 37 individual members and 7 non-individual members at present. The members are mainly from the Tokyo area and its vicinity.

In the near future, we hope that more non-individual members as well as individual members will join the Japanese branch of IAML and that the branch's activities will spread and cover all areas of Japan.
